REGISTRATION FEE:

A one-time \$20 registration fee is due upon enrollment for each new family. This is non-refundable.

TUITION:

\$30/month per student

CLASS ATTENDANCE: It is important for each student's success, that they attend all classes. We do understand that things come up, sickness happens, etc. Out of consideration for the instructor(s), please contact the studio via email or text message with notice of absence (esp close to performance time!).

ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE: Please make every attempt to arrive in a timely manner to class. Students should be ready to walk in class at start time; meaning that it is best to arrive a few minutes early to prepare for class. Students repeatedly arriving more than 10 minutes late to class may be asked to sit out and watch. After class, please be available to pick up your child immediately. Unfortunately, we do not keep an in-house babysitter and children are not to be left to their own devices. For safety precautions, students (children in general) will NOT be permitted to leave the building without an adult.

CLASS ATTIRE: Students are to come to class in proper attire.

Ballet I and II: ballet shoes, leotard, tights, skirt/shorts Ballet III and above: leotard, tights, skirt/shorts. NO t-shirts or pants.

Colors and styles are up to the student/parent (remember modesty please).

Inquire with Ashney about ordering ballet shoes, leotards, tights, etc.

No food or gum in class. Only water is acceptable and highly recommended.

Besides the things mentioned above, students are expected to be clothed with good manners and honor towards their classmates.

PERFORMANCE: We typically hold two performances per year. One at Christmas and one in Spring. A portion of class is structured around these activities so it is of importance that Ashney be notified ASAP if a student will be unable to perform. It is difficult to change choreography at the last minute. We appreciate your consideration of this.

Performance dates/times are released ASAP. We typically hold a bake sale (everyone's encouraged to participate) to help generate funds for the studio, which keeps costs low for each family. We also offer a DVD recording of the performance for purchase.

Community Mindfulness: We are a Christian driven studio and through-out the year we try and be "others-minded" as much as possible. We take opportunity to raise money, visit the elderly, and in any way serve those around us in need. It is more blessed to give than to receive, and this is a characteristic we want to sow into our students.
